# Keeping Safe



**Only use sparklers under the supervision of an adult.**

**Under 5's should not be given sparklers.**

# Keeping Safe

**Only adults should buy or touch fireworks.**

**If someone tries to give you a firework – say NO**



# Firework Misuse

If someone is silly or not careful with fireworks or sparklers people can get hurt or be affected.

# Firework Code: Storage

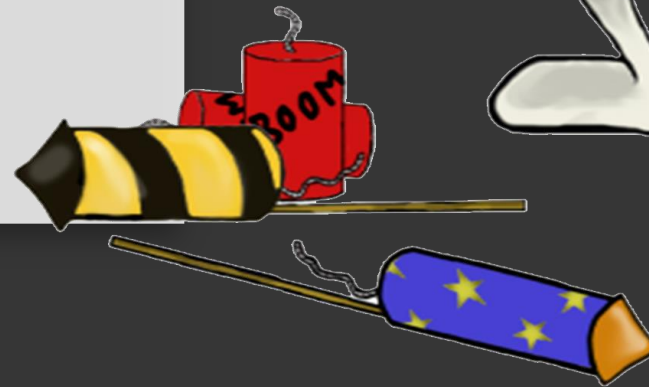
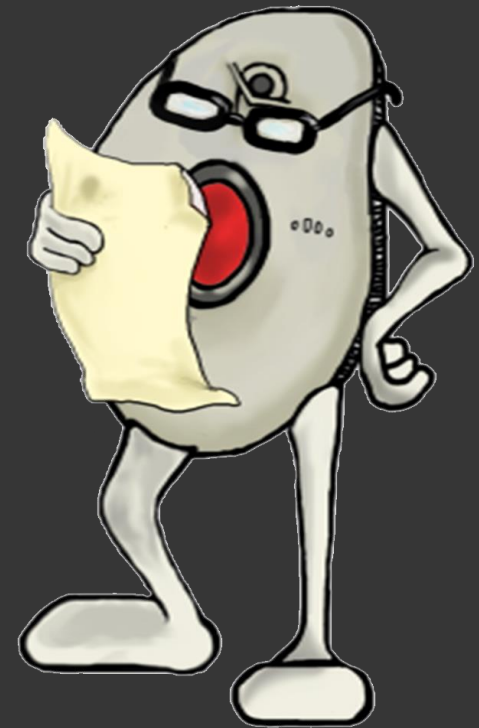


**Fireworks should be kept in a closed box.**

**Never throw fireworks  
or  
put them in your pocket.**

**Adults must follow the instructions carefully for each firework.**





# **Firework Code: Bonfires**

# Firework Code: Stand well back



**Stay near Mum or Dad or another adult and never go near a firework that has been lit.**

# Firework Code: Timing



**Fireworks  
must not be  
set off late  
at night and  
never after  
11pm.**



# Firework Code: Sparklers



If children are aged 5 or over they can use sparklers

but

light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
