Keeping Safe



Only use sparklers under the supervision of an adult.

Under 5's should not be given sparklers.

Keeping Safe

Only adults should buy or touch fireworks.

If someone tries to give you a firework – say NO



Firework Misuse

If someone is silly or not careful with fireworks or sparklers people can get hurt or be affected.


Firework Code: Storage




Fireworks should be kept in a closed box.

Never throw fireworks or put them in your pocket.

Firework Code: Read Instructions



Firework Code: Bonfires



Stand well back from fireworks and bonfires – don't touch!

Firework Code: Stand well back



Stay near Mum or Dad or another adult and never go near a firework that has been lit.

Firework Code: Pets

Keep your pets safe indoors so they don't get scared.



Firework Code: Timing



Fireworks must not be set off late at night and never after 11pm.

Firework Code: Sparklers



If children are aged 5 or over they can use sparklers

but light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.

and

ALWAYS FOLLOW
THE FIREWORK CODE
