e.g. What things do they like to get involved in?

What are they often asking questions about?

Is there anything significant happening in your child's life at the moment e.g. visits, holidays, new pets, family celebrations?

Does your child like performing? Are there any shows, stories or songs that they enjoy and like to replicate?

Do you have anything you would like to ask us about school or your child's progress and development at school?

This topic may have some sensitive issues for some families. Is there anything you would like us to consider when planning for your child?
