Coming to the stay and plays! We thought it was fun to meet the other children and to see what was in our classroom. Lots of us remembered different parts of the classroom or a particular toy. Key Vocabulary

- Topic words: Family, community, unique
- Behaviour for learning vocabulary: confident, brave, resilient
- We are working on speaking in full sentences e.g. 'please can I...', 'I would like...', and using people's names when talking to others.
- If your child watches TV, *Numberblocks* is an educational programme that helps mathematical understanding, and *Alphablocks* is good for phonics
- One minute maths app by White Rose Maths is another a good tool for helping mathematical understanding. If you would prefer to not use a screen, I can show you the type of activities they do.

Important days and dates

PE is on a **Friday**. Children should be in an active uniform anyway so you shouldn't need to do anything extra for this (see the website for more info on uniform).

All children have books now, and later, as we teach the children more letters and their corresponding sounds, we will send home some decodable books. For now we will concentrate on developing vocabulary relating to stories by looking at wordless books.

Reading books will be changed on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. This is to encourage re-reading books to help build fluency and comprehension. Thank you for reading with your child as much as possible and recording it in your home-school journal. Remember to bring these in everyday so we can pass on messages easily. Thank you.
