



Last half-term, we enjoyed learning about the Industrial Revolution and how Britain became such an important country to the rest of the world; looking at different types of writing such as Street Child; diary entries and non-chronological reports; refining our art skills by learning about perspective to create tiled prints of a river; learning about electrical circuits to create a morse code machine; practising our cricket skills in lots of different activities; singing at Ashton Hall in the Lancaster District Singing Festival with over 400 other children; learning how sound is formed, works and travels; and how to code an app with variables such as a score!

This half-term, we are looking forward to learning about migration and the history of the British Isles; exploring and developing our sculpture skills based on the works of Claes Oldenberg; learning about our environment and living things and how to classify them; creating a passport cover in our DT lessons; sports day and outdoor athletics activities in P.E.; refining our English skills by looking at the writing of Michael Morpurgo and other influential authors; practising our maths skills further by learning about measures, shape and money; learning more about the history of music and how to repeat codes to create sophisticated apps.
