Last half-term, we enjoyed...

A warm welcome back and welcome to our final term from the Red Class team! The children are making fantastic progress and are so happy and settled on their return to school. They continue to make us so very proud!

- Behaviour for learning vocabulary: determined, effort, positive
- Maths vocabulary: greater, more, less, fewer, heavy, light, longer, shorter
- Phonics words, phoneme, grapheme, digraph, build, blend, smooth read, segment
- Book words: characters, setting, author, illustrator, fiction (story), non-fiction (information)
- We are working on asking questions using when, what, why, how and using conjunction words and, because and when
