a really busy and rewarding term. We thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Romans in history, especially our visit to Ribchester Roman Museum, where the children had the opportunity to handle artefacts and explore real Roman sites. In geography, we developed our understanding of rivers and how they shape both the landscape and human life, which sparked lots of thoughtful discussion.

We were incredibly proud of the effort the children put into their English work, particularly their traditional tales, where they showed growing confidence in structure, vocabulary and creativity. In science, we explored states of matter and carried out a range of investigations, with the children asking sensible questions and beginning to think more scientifically about the world around them.
